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Gratton School will provide an additional thirty (30) days of programming on the confirmed dates of **July 18-22, 2022** (5) and **July 25-29, 2022** (5), and the following tentative dates in 2023: February 21-24 (4), April 7 and 10-14 (6), June 5-9 (5) and 12-16 (5).

The program for Gratton Elementary and Gratton Charter will be offered at 4500 S. Gratton Road, Denair, CA 95316, and run from 6:00am – 3:00pm, with breakfast and lunch being provided. Regular school rules and regulations as found within our Comprehensive Safety Plan and Return to Safe Schools Plan will be followed to ensure student health and safety.

Staff members are designing engaging activities inclusive of academics, visual and performing arts, and physical activity. Students will be grouped in appropriate multi-grade cohorts dependent upon enrollment, with supervision and instruction being provided by school staff. Additionally, community partnerships are being considered and various enrichment opportunities such as lessons and presentations may be scheduled within the program hours.

Active and Engaged Learning

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Gratton School Expanded Learning Opportunities Program will be unique from the regular instructional day in that students will be grouped in multi-grade cohorts and regular curriculum will not be used within the activities. Students will engage in hands-on, peer-learning activities that promote collaboration and reinforcement of previously taught foundational skills.

The majority of the day will be dedicated to enrichment activities such as visual and performing arts and outdoor physical interaction, all activities will be aligned with a weekly theme to encourage participation and engagement.

Skill Building

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Activities are being carefully selected to reinforce both academic, physical, and emotional skills. The goal of the Gratton Expanded Learning Opportunities Program is to create a fun and engaging environment which embeds opportunities for students to apply their foundational skills of life and prior school experiences to experiences. The program instructional approach will be more problem-solving rather than teacher delivery which will result in application and further development of skills.

Instructional time will include activities such as read-alouds with supported conversation to further develop comprehension, carefully selected games to reinforce critical thinking skills, and various STEM activities.

Youth Voice and Leadership

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Through the multi-grade cohorts, older students will be partnered with younger students in a manner to promote and support guidance and leadership. Older students will also have opportunities to serve as Program Helpers in various roles from the classroom to the playground. Each week of programming will offer a day of choice activities both indoor and outdoor. Furthermore, after the initial two weeks of programming, Gratton will seek input from students and families to develop the remaining days of programming to occur later in the year.

Healthy Choices and Behaviors

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In addition to recess breaks, programming will include daily outdoor activities to promote physical movement and development of healthy habits. These activities will be led by the school staff in an organized approach to ensure student safety and health.

Breakfast and Lunch will be served each day of programming in accordance with School Food Guidelines and Regulation.

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As every student is invited to the Gratton Extended Learning Opportunities Program, equity in access is embedded into the design of the program. The staff is selecting activities, such as read-alouds and art/craft projects which reflect and represent a variety of cultures and communities. Should any student participating in program need additional support for language and or educational needs (English Learners or Students with Disabilities), Gratton School will ensure access to the accommodations or additional supports necessary.

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Gratton School has surveyed our Teaching and Support Staffs and have secured multiple instructors for the confirmed programming dates. Teachers are designing the programming and will be the lead on instructional delivery with assistance provided from Support Staff.

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The Gratton School Extended Learning Opportunities Program will be overseen by the Superintendent of the school, Mrs. Williams in partnership with the school staff providing instruction and supervision.

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As Gratton School is a small, rural school, our TK/K population is relatively small. Dependent on the number of TK/K students who elect to participate in our programming, we will design our multi-grade cohorts accordingly. Furthermore, should the TK/K participation rate be so large to necessitate additional instructional support, we will meet that requirement.

Staff is designing the program activities to meet the developmental needs of all students in grades, TK-Sixth.
